### HFR shouldn't mean outsourcing VIA Rail services

Hello ,

The response to our survey was overwhelming and decisive: **The vast majority of our members and supporters want High Frequency Rail to proceed, and think the government is taking far too long getting the project approved and built.** However, the message was also loud and clear on a couple of key points: First of all, the Windsor to Quebec City corridor is not the only priority the government should be working on, with ensuring the continuity of long-distance services and the restoration of the Calgary-Edmonton corridor both being high priorities, including for members who live along the Windsor to Quebec City corridor. Secondly, your responses **strongly reject the outsourcing of VIA Rail's corridor services** to a private sector partner, as proposed by the federal government on March 9th.

Over the course of a series of meetings with the Assistant Deputy Minister responsible for High Frequency Rail and with Minister of Transport Omar Alghabra, we have sought an explanation for their choice of procurement methodology, and asked for the Joint Project Office's full report to be made public. We have yet to receive either, but Minister Alghabra and his colleagues expressed enthusiasm for passenger rail and public transit as key elements in building a strong, inclusive and sustainable economy while fulfilling Canada's climate commitments, including outside the corridor. VIA Rail, transit agencies and passengers have not always enjoyed such a level of policy support from Canada's federal government, but unfortunately this was not reflected in this year's federal budget, which once again failed to provide funding to start the urgently needed replacement of the long-distance train fleet.

The rest of VIA Rail's vital network across Canada could be at risk if more the 90% or services and 75% of revenues from the corridor are in the hands of a private sector partner. Worse, the private sector partner would be expected to take a gamble on ridership and revenue projections up to 50 years into the future, while inheriting many of the challenges and risks VIA faces today. Any private sector consortium would also almost certainly have to include a European or Asian state-owned passenger railway company, doing the job that VIA Rail, our Canadian state-owned passenger railway company, was created to do.

We will be urging the government to proceed with HFR, but with full transparency, sooner, and on the basis of VIA Rail continuing to directly operate Canada's passenger railway.

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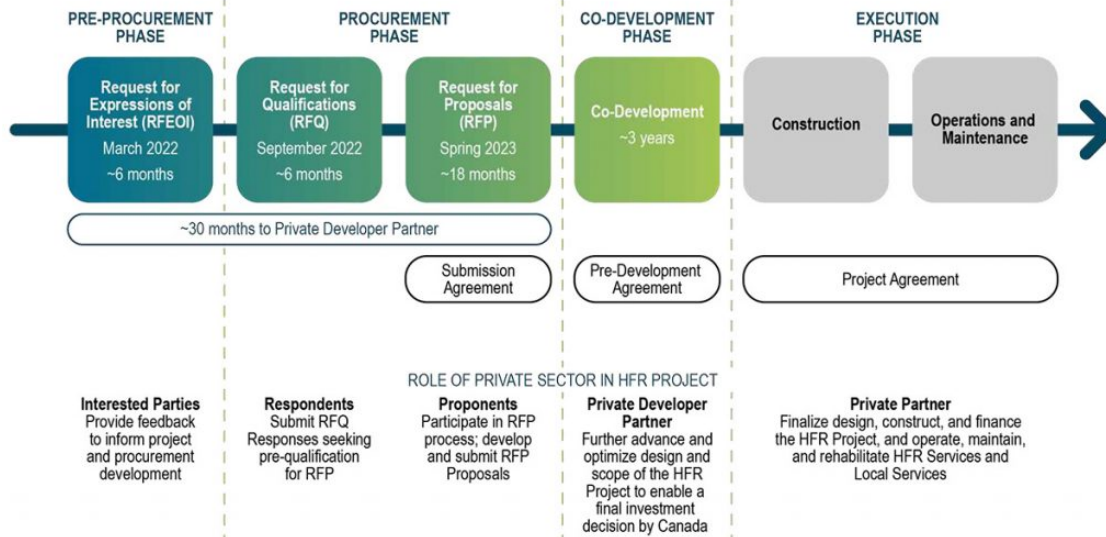
