

Transport Action News - April 2023

Hello,

We were expecting news about the future of the railway on Vancouver Island on March 14th. What Canada and BC delivered instead was uncertainty. We welcome the expressed commitments to both to reconciliation and to the future of the corridor, and hope that a new round of study and consultation will finally lead to substantive action. Transport Action BC has also been collaborating with All Aboard Washington and the Association of Oregon Rail and Transit Advocates to produce a joint policy statement on the Amtrak Cascades service and sustainable transportation across the Pacific Northwest.

The federal government and Ontario didn't renew operational funding support in their spring budgets, although other provinces did, putting the TTC and other agencies facing damaging service cuts, just when ridership is returning, as detailed in our story below. Funding shortfalls also hamper efforts to deploy additional safety to improve safety, and we are supporting ATU Canada's call for urgent action to address the recent upsurge in violent incidents on transit systems across Canada.

Fare integration was also absent from the Ontario budget, but speaking at the Toronto Region Board of Trade's Transportation Symposium on March 30, Minister Stan Cho committed to TTC fare integration by the end of the year. We welcome this commitment! High Frequency Rail was

also a major topic at that event, which two Transport Action board members attended, with a speech by VIA-HFR board chair Robert Prichard and the opportunity meeting the new interim CEO, Marc-Olivier Ranger, and other members of the rapidly growing team handling the procurement process.

In March, we also submitted a brief for the US Federal Railroad Administration's study of Amtrak's long distance services, supporting the efforts of the Big Sky Passenger Rail Authority to reinstate the North Coast Hiawatha - a service cut analogous the the loss of the *Canadian* through Calgary - and to emphasize opportunities for renewed and enhanced cross-border connections.
