

Transport Action News - September 2023 HFR and SW Ontario advocacy updates

Hello,

Maintaining its heritage stations across Canada, despite not being allowed to run nearly enough passenger service to them, is a major responsibility for VIA Rail. Therefore, this month's announcement of \$80 million for this work is appreciated. Some projects are already well advanced, including roof repairs at Quebec City's Gare de Palais, seen above.

Our advocacy for regional rail in southwestern Ontario continues, with London Mayor Josh Morgan meeting with board members Ken Westcar, Tariq Khan and myself on August 10. Transport Action supports London's vision of a rail, motorcoach, and intercommunity bus hub, with increased VIA Rail service as previously promised by the federal government.

In this month's newsletter we also bring you a rural transit success story from Simcoe County, Ontario. Thanks to supporters like you, Transport Action can advocate for many more such projects across the country that help people get around their communities and connect to passenger rail services for longer trips. Let us know if you're reach out to your municipality or would like advice on doing so.

We are grateful to the Toronto Railway Historical Association for hosting a presentation on August 17, in which we explored opportunities for passenger rail investments ahead of the HFR project and outside of the Toronto-Quebec corridor. If you missed the presentation, you can download the slide deck: <u>Beyond HFR: Advancing Passenger Rail Across Canada</u>.

At the end of the August, I also met with Jacques Fauteux and Sophie Roux from VIA-HFR to get an update on project progress and discuss Transport Action's ongoing concerns about the project's timeline and proposed outsourcing of operations. With three teams selected for the RFP phase, VIA-HFR is also commencing field studies along the route. (Details in the article below.) Transport Action will continue to ask the federal government and VIA-HFR to advance projects that also deliver benefits to VIA Rail's current operations, such as the announced plan to rebuild Dorval station as a multimodal hub, track improvements between Fallowfield and Ottawa, and the proposed Kingston Hub. It is also crucial to advance long-lead-time items like constructing a new tunnel to allow trains from Laval to reach Montreal's Central Station.
